

THE IRVING MARSH COLLECTION OF SPORTS BOOKS

Irving T. Marsh (1907 - 1982), a native New Yorker, was among the fundamental figures in the growth of college basketball as a major sport. Marsh was assistant sports editor of the *Herald Tribune*. Marsh started at the paper as a copy boy while still a student at City College. By 1930, he was regularly covering college basketball, then a sport confined to local rivalries in cramped campus gyms. An occasional "big game" found its way to an armory. Ned Irish introduced intersectional doubleheaders to the Garden in December 1934 and Marsh was quick to see the potential of the sport. He helped organize the Metropolitan Basketball Writers Association that year and, in 1938, was a leader in founding the N.I.T., which was originally sponsored by the writers group. Marsh was also attracted by college football, partly because of the *Herald Tribune's* sponsorship of an All-Star game for the benefit of the Fresh Air Fund and partially because of his association with Columbia. He served three terms (1942-47, 1951-53, and 1966-68) as Columbia's sports information director. Marsh (along with Everett B. Morris of the *Herald Tribune*) started the East-West College All-Star basketball game at the Garden in 1946. The annual event, which ran until 1964, was also a benefit for the Fresh Air Fund. Marsh was not only active in the promotion of the Garden event but also in the assembling of the teams and maintaining the relationship with the N.C.A.A. and the colleges whose players appeared in the game. The All-Star game gave heightened visibility to college players and the schools they represented. Marsh was instrumental in developing the Eastern College Athletic Conference into a major factor in the organization of college sports. The E.C.A.C. began (as the central office of Eastern Intercollegiate Athletics) in 1938 primarily as a clearinghouse for the assignment of game officials. It later grew into an organization of over 100 colleges that conducted championships in several sports. Marsh founded the E.C.A.C. Service Bureau, its publicity and statistical arm, in 1947. The *Herald Tribune* closed in 1966 and Marsh worked for its ill-fated successor, the *World Journal Tribune*, until it closed May 5, 1967. In July 1969, he became the full-time head of the E.C.A.C. Service Bureau in Manhattan. He retired in June 1973. Marsh and Edward Ehre founded and co-edited the hardcover book annual, *Best Sports Stories* (E.P. Dutton), from 1945 to 1980, a book that helped elevate sportswriting and also recognized its quality. (SOURCE: Bill Shannon Biographical Dictionary of New York Sports, New York Historical Society)



The Marsh collection of sport books - more than 125 titles - remained in Marsh's house in North Canaan, Connecticut from his death in 1982 until recently when his heirs sold the property. Marsh did not have the practice of writing his name or affixing a bookplate to his books, but the provenance is clear. Unless otherwise noted, books are hardcover. Many of the books are advance review copies, which likely came to him as an editor at the *Herald Tribune*. Some are inscribed to him by other sports writers of the period. The books are in generally good condition, some almost as new, some with worn dustjackets; major defects are noted. The collection, \$2,500.

A native Virginian and an Army veteran, Edmunds gave up a law practice to write full-time, publishing books that were highly conventional formally but often controversial in their subject matter. In 1961, Meany joined the New York Mets baseball team as a publicity director, and later served as their promotions director.

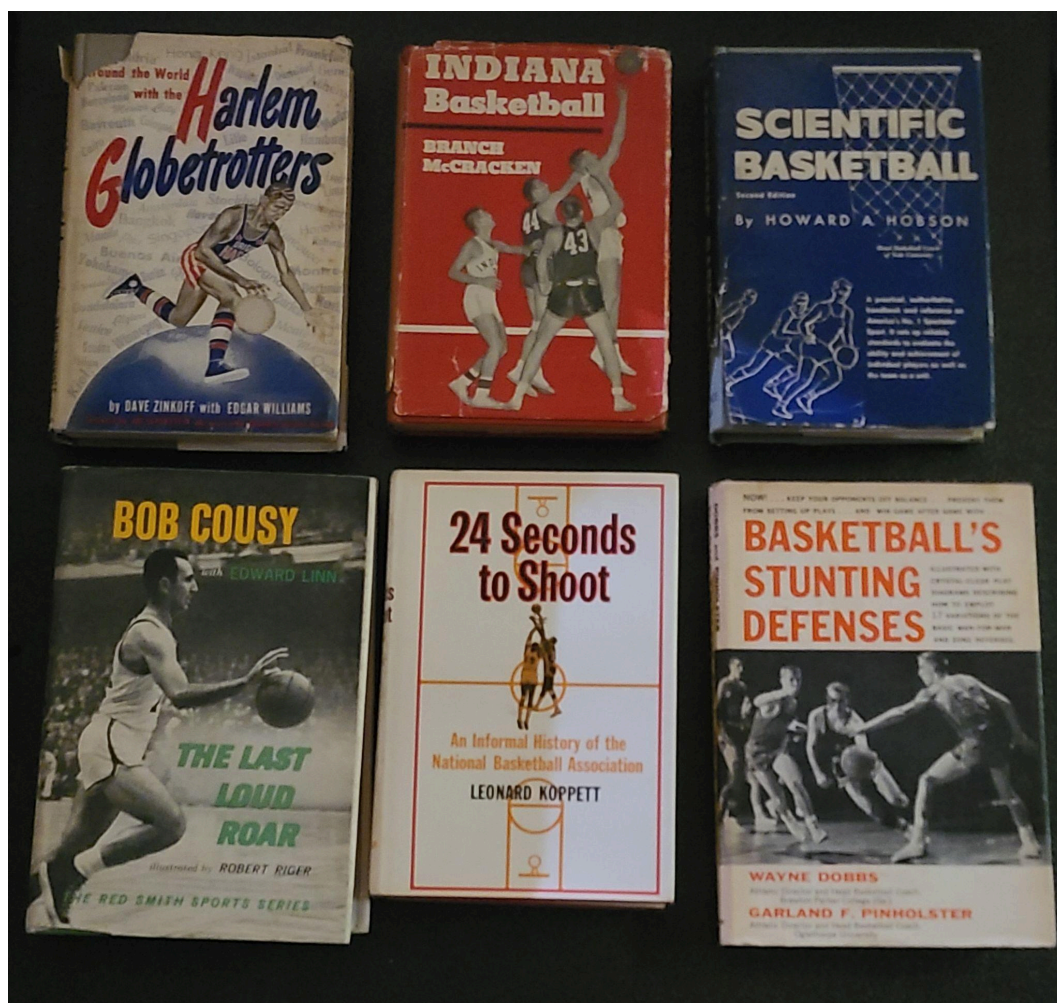

Koppett served in the United States Army before graduating from Columbia University in 1946. He then worked as a reporter and columnist for the New York Herald Tribune, the New York Post, The New York Times, the Peninsula Times Tribune, and The Sporting News, and authored 22 books on sports. 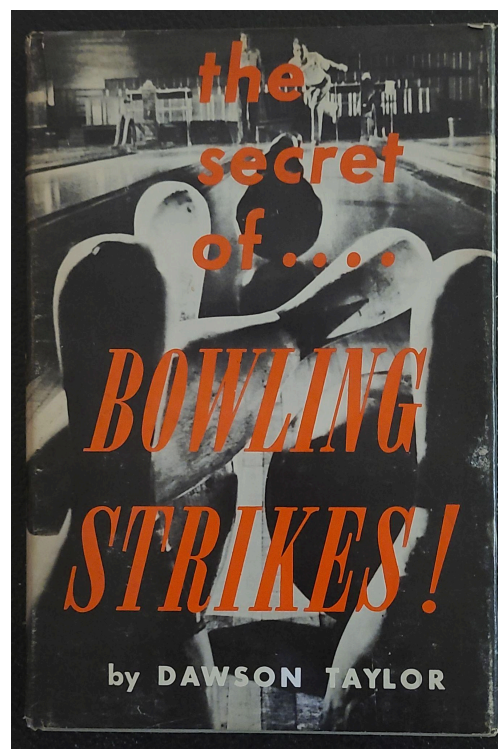

Blaik Earl Henry "Red" Blaik (1897 – 1989) was an American football player, coach, college athletics administrator, and United States Army officer. He served as the head football coach at Dartmouth College from 1934 to 1940 and at the United States Military Academy from 1941 to 1958, compiling a career college football record of 166–48–14. His Army football teams won three consecutive national championships in 1944, 1945 and 1946. Blaik was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame as a coach in 1964 (Source: Wikipedia). Tim Cohane (b.1942) co-authored this book while in college and went on to a career coaching basketball. He resigned as head coach at the University of Buffalo five



games into the 1999–2000 season, as a result of an NCAA investigation, which alleged that he violated NCAA rules.. In 2004 Cohane filed a long-running lawsuit against the NCAA, the University at Buffalo, and the Mid-American Conference, accusing them of conspiring to remove him as coach and denying Cohane of due process. 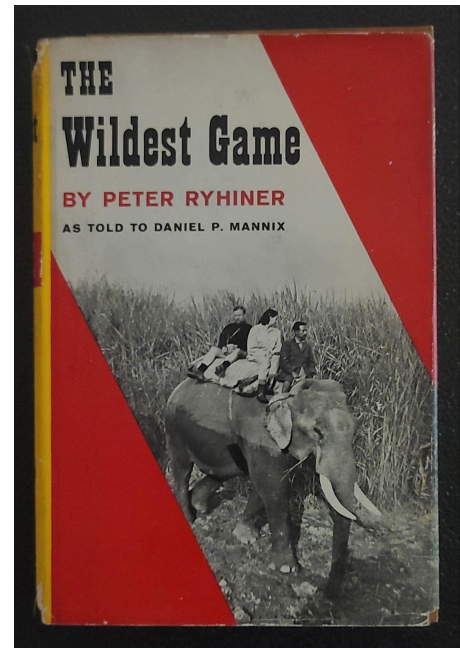

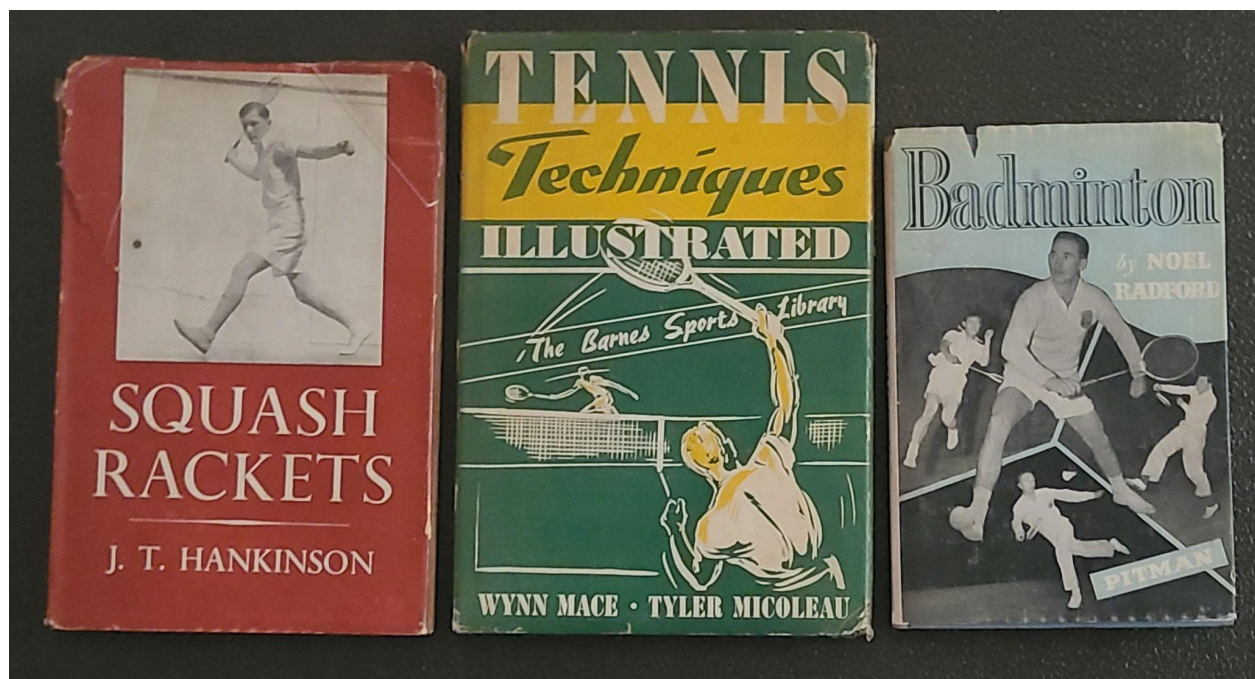

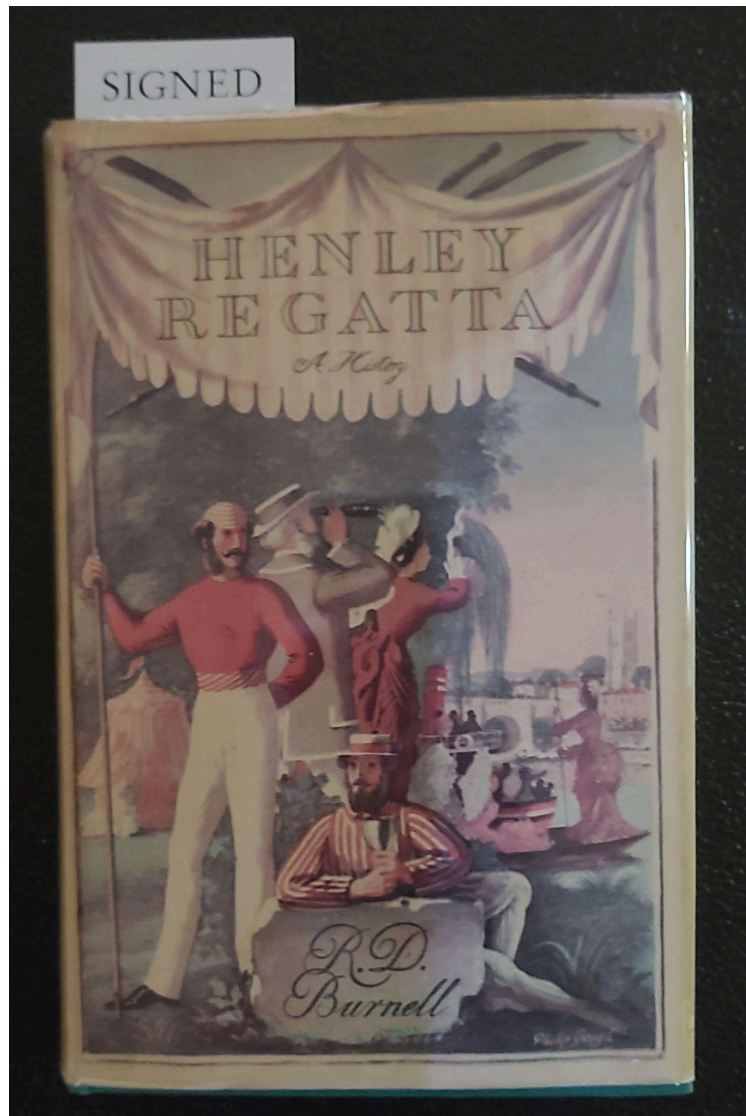

Harron (1897-1969) was one of the country's most respected sports reporters, for *The Boston Transcript* from 1920 -1924 and then for *The New York Post* from 1924 -1933, and was involved in establishing the Ivy League. After World War II, he became director of public relations and assistant to the president at Columbia. His inscription to Marsh suggests that Marsh somehow accredited Harron so that he could attend the Henley race. Author Burnell (1917 - 1995) was an English rower who won a gold medal at the 1948 Olympics alongside Bert Bushnell in the double sculls. He and his father Charles are the only father and son in Olympic history to have both won gold medals in rowing. (Source: Wikipedia).
